

Adding wiring from the distribution box

Proper wiring of a distribution box involves securely connecting input and output wires to breakers and terminals, ensuring correct phase, neutral, and earth connections, and testing for safety before powering on.

Preparation and Safety

Before starting, turn off the main power supply to prevent electrical shock. Gather necessary tools such as wire strippers, screwdrivers, a multimeter, zip ties, and appropriate wire gauges. Wiring Steps

- o Identify Input and Output Wires: Determine the incoming live (phase), neutral, and earth wires from the main supply and the outgoing wires for each circuit .
- o Connect the Main Supply: Attach the incoming live wire to the main MCB terminal, the neutral wire to the neutral link, and the earth wire to the earth link .
- o Install Circuit Breakers: Place the MCBs or RCCBs in their designated slots. Connect the output wires of the main MCB to the input of the RCCB if used, then connect the output of the RCCB to the input of the load MCBs .
- o Connect Load Circuits: For single-pole MCBs, connect only the phase wire to the breaker and neutral to the neutral link. For double-pole MCBs, connect both phase and neutral wires to the breaker. Connect the earth wire to the earth link .
- o Wire Management: Arrange wires neatly inside the box, secure them with zip ties, and leave space for heat dissipation. Avoid tangling or contact with sharp edges .

Testing and Verification

- o Insulation Test: Use an insulation resistance tester to check the insulation between wires and the box; values should meet relevant standards .
- o Circuit Test: Use a multimeter to verify that each circuit is correctly connected and there are no short circuits or broken wires .
- o Labeling: Clearly label each breaker and wire for easy identification and future maintenance .
