Telecommunications in Argentina are regulated under cabinet-level oversight, primarily through ENACOM, with public tenders and government decrees guiding network infrastructure and service provision.

Regulatory and Cabinet Oversight

Telecommunications in Argentina fall under the supervision of the Jefatura de Gabinete de Ministros (Chief of Cabinet of Ministers), with the Ente Nacional de Comunicaciones (ENACOM) acting as the autonomous regulatory authority . ENACOM oversees licensing, spectrum allocation, and compliance with national telecom policies. The Argentine cabinet, through ministerial decrees and secretariats, can issue directives affecting the sector, including classifying services like internet, mobile, and fixed telephony as essential public services, which impacts tariffs and service obligations .

Recent Government Actions

The Argentine government has actively promoted state involvement and investment in telecommunications, including initiatives like Argentina Conectada, which expands broadband and digital TV access in underserved areas . Investments in fiber-optic networks and 5G deployment are encouraged through regulatory approvals and public-private partnerships. For example, Telecom Argentina's acquisition of Telefonica's operations in 2025 required regulatory filings with ENACOM and antitrust authorities, reflecting cabinet-level oversight in major telecom transactions .

Public Tenders and Procurement

The Argentine cabinet and ministries issue telecommunications-related tenders for network equipment, services, and infrastructure . Recent tenders include:

- o Acquisition of electrical and telephony materials for government offices and emergency management services.
- o Procurement of Starlink satellite internet equipment, including mini antennas, transformers, and cabling for public service use.
- o Supply of telecom hardware and office equipment for various ministries and health regions. These tenders are publicly listed and managed through official channels, ensuring transparency and compliance with cabinet directives .
