Cameroon is classified as a lower-middle-income country and an emerging and developing economy, with a decentralized unitary state governance system.

Economic Classification

Cameroon is considered a lower-middle-income country according to the World Bank, based on its Gross National Income (GNI) per capita and other economic indicators (2023 data) . In the World Bank's income and lending categories, lower-middle-income countries fall under the broader group of middle-income countries, which also includes upper-middle-income nations. Middle-income countries collectively account for a significant portion of the global population and GDP, and they face challenges such as infrastructure development, investment capital shortages, and governance issues . The International Monetary Fund (IMF) classifies Cameroon as part of the emerging and developing economies group, distinguishing it from advanced economies. This classification is used for analytical purposes and reflects Cameroon's ongoing development trajectory and economic potential .

Governance and Administrative Classification

Cameroon is a decentralized unitary state with a presidential system. The President serves as the head of state and is elected for a renewable seven-year term by universal suffrage . Legislative power is exercised by a bicameral parliament, consisting of the National Assembly and the Senate. The Senate represents the Decentralized Local and Regional Authorities (DLRAs), with members elected regionally or appointed by the president . The country has implemented subnational decentralization, guided by laws such as Law 2019/024, which defines the framework for local governance, the autonomy of local authorities, and the financial system of subnational governments . Ministries such as the Ministry of Subnational Administration and Decentralization (MINATD) and the Ministry of Decentralization and Local Development (MINDDEVEL) oversee the organization, supervision, and implementation of decentralization policies .
