- o Rack or Cabinet: The main structural frame, often 19-inch standard, supporting all fiber terminations.
- o Fiber Units/Modules: Areas for installing adapters, splice trays, and storing excess fiber.
- o Management Units: Cable guides, wraps, and organizers to maintain proper routing and prevent fiber stress.
- o Patch Panels: Modular units inside the ODF for cross-connecting fibers.
- o Accessories: Rings, holders, and labeling systems to ensure neat and efficient fiber management.
