This identification scheme follows the TIA/EIA-598, "Optical Fiber Cable Color Coding." This standard is adopted by; Telcordia GR-20 - Generic Requirements for Optical Fiber and Optical. The color arrangement for optical fiber cables is standardized to ensure consistent identification of individual fibers during installation, splicing, and maintenance.
