

Configure the optical fiber migration cable connection to the switch

To connect a fiber optic migration cable to a network switch, use compatible SFP transceivers, duplex LC fiber cables, and configure the switch ports and VLANs appropriately.

Step 1: Select the Correct SFP Transceiver

Choose an SFP module that matches the fiber type (single-mode OS2 or multimode OM3) and the bandwidth of your switch (1G SFP, 10G SFP+, or QSFP for higher speeds) to ensure proper signal transmission . Ensure the transceiver is compatible with your switch model to avoid unpredictable behavior .

Step 2: Prepare the Fiber Optic Cable

Use duplex fiber optic cabling with LC connectors on both ends. Pre-terminated cables are recommended for simplicity, but bulk fiber can be terminated in the field if necessary . When connecting two switches, reverse the connections between the SFP ports (TX of switch A to RX of switch B and vice versa) to maintain proper send/receive alignment .

Step 3: Connect the Fiber to the Switch

Insert the SFP transceiver into the fiber-enabled port on the switch. Connect the LC connectors of the duplex fiber cable to the transceiver, ensuring a secure and clean connection. Avoid bending the fiber sharply to prevent signal loss .

Step 4: Configure the Switch Ports

Log into the switch using a terminal client (e.g., PuTTY) and configure the fiber-enabled ports for the correct speed and duplex mode. If required, assign the ports to a VLAN dedicated to the fiber connection to separate traffic and optimize network performance . Example commands on a Cisco switch:

```
interface GigabitEthernet1/0/1
switchport mode access
switchport access vlan 10
speed 1000
duplex full
no shutdown
```

Step 5: Verify and Save Configuration

After connecting the fiber and configuring the ports, verify the link status using commands like `show interfaces status` or `show interface transceiver details`. Ensure the link is up and there are no errors. Finally, save the configuration to the switch memory:

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copy running-config startup-config

This ensures the settings persist after a reboot .

Step 6: Troubleshooting Tips

- o Confirm fiber type compatibility between switches and transceivers .
- o Check for clean connectors; dust or dirt can degrade performance.
- o Ensure TX/RX alignment is correct; reversed connections prevent communication .
- o Use original manufacturer SFPs to avoid unpredictable behavior . By following these steps, your fiber optic migration cable will be properly connected, and the switch will be configured for reliable high-speed communication.
