

Connecting a PoE switch to a DVR

You can connect a PoE switch to a DVR by linking the IP cameras to the switch, connecting the switch to the DVR or router, and configuring network settings for centralized video recording.

Step-by-Step Setup

1. Connect IP Cameras to the PoE Switch Use Ethernet cables to connect each IP camera to the PoE switch. The switch will provide both power and data to the cameras, eliminating the need for separate power cables. Ensure the switch is 802.3af/at compliant to support your cameras . 2. Connect the PoE Switch to the DVR or Router

- o If your DVR has a network port, connect it directly to one of the switch's uplink ports.

- o If using a router, connect the PoE switch to the router's LAN port. This allows the DVR and cameras to communicate over the same network . 3. Power the PoE Switch Plug the PoE switch into a power outlet. Once powered, the switch will supply electricity to the connected cameras and enable data transmission . 4. Configure the DVR Network Settings

- o Assign a compatible IP address to the DVR within your local network (e.g., 192.168.1.xxx) to avoid conflicts with other devices.

- o Access the DVR's network settings to detect or manually add each camera using its IP address.

- o Ensure cameras are on the same subnet as the DVR for proper communication . 5. Test the System Verify that each camera's video feed is visible on the DVR. Check motion detection, recording, and network stability. Adjust IP addresses or switch ports if necessary .
