Variations by Application: Residential boxes typically include 6-24 circuits with standard breakers for lighting, outlets, and appliances. Commercial and industrial boxes may include specialized breakers for heavy machinery, three-phase power, and monitoring systems. Portable or temporary distribution boxes may have fewer circuits and sometimes rely on upstream protection, but many still include integrated breakers for safety .
