Meter Boxes

A meter box is an enclosure designed to house the electricity meter and related service connections. It serves as the formal interface between the utility power supply and a building's internal electrical system. Typically installed on an exterior wall or at the point of entry, meter boxes allow easy access for meter reading, inspection, and maintenance. They protect the meter from weather, tampering, and accidental contact while ensuring authorized utility access. The primary purpose is to measure energy consumption accurately for billing and monitoring .

Distribution Boxes

A distribution box, also called a distribution board or panel, receives power from the main supply and distributes it to multiple branch circuits within a building. It houses protective devices such as MCBs (Miniature Circuit Breakers), RCCBs (Residual Current Circuit Breakers), or RCBOs to safeguard circuits against overloads, short circuits, and leakage currents. Distribution boxes are usually installed indoors in service rooms or accessible locations for routine operation and maintenance. Their main function is to control and manage electrical flow to lighting, appliances, and equipment while providing essential protection .

Key Differences

- o Function: Meter boxes measure electricity; distribution boxes distribute and protect circuits.
- o Location: Meter boxes are typically outside; distribution boxes are usually inside.
- o Components: Meter boxes contain meters; distribution boxes contain breakers, fuses, and protective devices.
- o Sequence: Meter boxes are installed first, receiving power from the utility; distribution boxes are downstream, distributing power to circuits .
