

How long should a cable tray be horizontally fixed

Article Overview

For horizontal cable trays, supports should typically be spaced between 1.5 meters and 3 meters, with additional supports at tray ends, bends, and every 3-5 meters along straight runs.

Recommended Support Spacing

For straight horizontal sections, the distance between supports (span) should generally range from 1.5 meters to 3 meters, depending on the tray type, material, and cable load. This spacing ensures structural stability, prevents sagging, and allows for easy maintenance and inspection (Apex Tray) . At corners, bends, or T-junctions, it is necessary to install one support on each side of the bend, arranged symmetrically, to prevent stress on the cables and maintain tray stability .

Securing Cables

Cables within the tray should be fixed at both ends, at bends, and at cable joints, and along straight horizontal runs every 3 to 5 meters to maintain organization and prevent displacement .

Additional Considerations

- o Fixed supports should be placed at the beginning and end of the tray, at corners, and when the tray spans more than 30 meters .
- o Hanging rod supports should have a minimum diameter of 8 mm and be installed at beam locations for robust structural stability .
- o Avoid placing direct plate connections at the midpoint of the span or on the support point to prevent stress concentration .
- o For long horizontal runs, consider the weight of cables and potential expansion due to temperature changes, especially in flexible systems, to prevent sagging or displacement .

Summary

In practice, a horizontal cable tray should be supported every 1.5-3 meters, with additional supports at ends, bends, and long spans, and cables should be secured every 3-5 meters along straight sections. Proper placement of supports and cable fixing ensures structural integrity, safety, and ease of maintenance.
