

How to assemble the legs of a construction site electrical distribution box

This prevents tipping and enhances safety . 7. Final Checks Verify that all bolts are tight, the box is stable, and there is no wobble. Ensure the area around the box is clear for cable routing and maintenance .

Safety Considerations

- o Always disconnect power before handling the box.
 - o Avoid placing the box near water, flammable materials, or corrosive substances .
 - o Follow manufacturer instructions and local electrical codes for installation.
 - o Use lifting equipment if the box is heavy to prevent injury .
