

How to configure jumpers for multimode optical modules

Use multimode fiber jumpers with the correct connector type and core arrangement to match the optical module specifications for proper signal transmission.

Selecting the Right Fiber Jumper

- o **Fiber Type:** Always use multimode fiber jumpers (OM3 or OM4) for multimode optical modules. Single-mode fibers are not compatible with multimode modules and will cause signal loss or failure .
- o **Connector Type:** Match the jumper connector to the optical module interface. Common connectors include LC, SC, and MPO/MTP. For parallel multimode modules like 40G SR4 or 100G SR4, MPO12/PC connectors are typically used, while 400G SR8 modules use MPO16/APC connectors .
- o **Jumper Length:** Choose jumper lengths based on the physical distance between devices, ensuring minimal slack while avoiding tension on the fibers .

MPO/MTP Jumper Configurations

- o **MPO-MPO Jumpers:** Straight-through jumpers with MPO connectors on both ends, used for direct connections between high-speed multimode modules or patch panels .
- o **MPO-LC/SC Fanout Jumpers:** Convert a high-density MPO interface to multiple duplex LC or SC connectors, allowing connection to SFP+ or SFP28 modules .
- o **Core Arrangement:** For 12-core MPO connectors in 40G/100G SR4 modules, fibers are arranged as TX 4 + middle 4 + RX 4. For 16-core MPO connectors in 400G SR8 modules, fibers are arranged to match the module's transmit and receive lanes .

Practical Steps for Jumper Configuration

- o Identify the optical module type (e.g., 40G SR4, 100G SR4, 400G SR8).
- o Select the matching multimode fiber jumper (OM3 or OM4) with the correct MPO/MTP or LC/SC connectors.
- o Ensure the fiber core count and sequence match the module's transmit (TX) and receive (RX) lanes.
- o Connect the jumper to the module, verifying that the connector polarity (A-to-A or A-to-B) aligns with the module's requirements.
- o Test the link for insertion loss and signal integrity to confirm proper configuration.

Additional Considerations

- o **Pinned vs. Non-Pinned MPO Connectors:** Pinned connectors are typically used on the transmitting side, while non-pinned connectors are used on the receiving side to maintain proper alignment .
- o **High-Density Deployments:** Use MPO/MTP jumpers for short-range connections within racks or between

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adjacent racks, typically ranging from 1 to 30 meters .

o Color Coding: Follow ANSI/TIA-598-D standards for multimode fiber color coding to avoid miswiring . By carefully selecting the fiber type, connector type, core arrangement, and jumper length, you can ensure reliable multimode optical module connections and maintain high-speed data transmission in your network.
