

How to connect a fiber optic cable wireless link

- o Power On the Router: Wait for the router's indicator lights to confirm a successful connection. Configure Wi-Fi settings if necessary .

- o Avoid Bending Fiber: Maintain the minimum bend radius to prevent breakage and signal loss .
- o Keep Fiber Clean: Dust or dirt on connectors can degrade performance. Use proper cleaning tools if needed .
- o Check Signal Quality: Use an optical power meter or OTDR to verify low-loss connections if splicing or terminating cables .
