Avoid daisy-chaining multiple strips, as this can overload the circuit . Keep cables organized and away from walkways to prevent tripping hazards. 5. **Placement and Environmental Considerations** Place the power strip in a dry, accessible location and avoid areas with water, mud, or heavy foot traffic . If outdoors, ensure the strip and connectors are weatherproof or protected by a cover. 6. **Testing Before Use** After connecting, perform a visual inspection and, if possible, use a multimeter to verify voltage and grounding. Ensure all breakers in the distribution box are functional and that the power strip operates correctly before connecting tools or equipment .
