

How to connect cable pulleys and cable trays

- o **Install Pulley Wheels:** Secure two pulley wheels above the cable tray using tie wraps or fasteners anchored to support beams or the ceiling slab .
- o **Create a Continuous Pull String:** Feed a pull string through the pulleys, looping it back to form a continuous system. Tie the ends together to complete the loop .
