

How to connect fiber optic cables to a switch and what are the prices

Steps to Connect Fiber Optic Cables

o Choose the Fiber Type

- o Multimode fiber (MMF) is suitable for short distances (under 1000 feet).

- o Plug the LC connectors of the fiber cable into the transceivers.
- o Verify link lights and test connectivity.

o Optional Components

- o Patch panels help organize multiple fiber connections.
- o Media converters are needed if the switch lacks SFP ports .

- o Star topology: All devices connect to a central switch, reducing collisions and improving performance.
- o Daisy chain: Switches are connected in series, which may be simpler but can reduce redundancy .
