After exposing the damaged section, remove the protective sheath using a fiber optic stripper and clean the fiber with alcohol and lint-free wipes . Use a high-precision fiber cleaver to prepare the fiber ends for splicing. Ensure there is enough slack in the cable to work comfortably without stressing undamaged sections .
