

How to install cable trays concealed

Concealed cable trays can be installed by carefully planning the route, selecting the right tray type, mounting supports at proper intervals, and securing trays with connectors while adhering to safety codes.

Planning and Preparation

Before installation, plan the cable tray route considering ceiling or wall space, load capacity, and clearance from other utilities like HVAC ducts or pipes (). Use a laser level or chalk line to mark the path for straight alignment. Identify locations for bends, tees, or risers to ensure smooth cable transitions ().

Selecting Tray Type

Choose a solid-bottom or ventilated tray depending on the environment and aesthetic requirements. Solid trays are ideal for concealed installations where visual appearance matters and heat buildup is minimal (). Ladder or perforated trays are better for airflow but may be less suitable for fully concealed setups ().

Mounting Supports

Install supports at regular intervals, typically every 1.5 to 3 meters depending on tray type and cable weight (). For ceiling installations, use trapeze hangers; for wall-mounted trays, use cantilever arms. Ensure anchors are appropriate for the building material (concrete, steel, or drywall) ().

Installing the Trays

- o Cut and deburr trays to fit the planned route using a hacksaw or angle grinder ().
- o Connect tray sections with splice plates or couplers to maintain structural integrity ().
- o Align trays straight and level before tightening fasteners to prevent sagging or misalignment ().
- o Install bends and risers carefully to maintain the minimum bend radius for cables and avoid sharp edges ().

Cable Laying and Safety

Once trays are installed, lay cables neatly, maintaining separation for power, control, and communication lines. Follow NEC fill ratios (usually max 50%) to prevent overheating (). Ground the tray system properly and ensure all fasteners are secure. Always wear PPE such as gloves, safety glasses, and a hard hat during installation ().

Final Checks



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- o Verify that all trays are level and securely fastened.
- o Ensure bends and risers meet minimum radius requirements.
