

How to secure the wiring in the terminal box

- o Insert the stripped wire fully into the terminal opening .
- o Tighten the terminal screw or clamp using a torque screwdriver or the recommended spring pressure to ensure a firm connection without overtightening .
- o For screw terminals, form a neat "crown" shape with the wire strands for even pressure distribution .
- o Tug-test each wire gently to confirm it is secure .

Step 5: Organize and Label

- o Keep wires neatly arranged using cable ties, ducts, or channels to prevent tangling and reduce stress on connections .
- o Label wires and terminal blocks clearly to simplify maintenance and troubleshooting .
- o Separate high-voltage and low-voltage wires and leave space for airflow to prevent overheating .

- o Inspect all connections for tightness, corrosion, or damage.
- o Ensure the terminal block is properly mounted and insulated to prevent accidental contact .
