

How to straighten the cable tray after installation

Walk the entire tray run to verify straightness, level, and proper support. Ensure no section is overfilled, and all cables are grouped and tied securely with nylon straps every few feet . Proper grounding and bonding at joints are essential for safety and compliance . Document the installation for future maintenance and audits.
