



Instructions for Connecting Electrical Boxes

- o Mount the boxes securely to studs or joists, ensuring they are flush with the wall surface. Metal boxes should have knockouts removed for wiring entry .
- o Ensure boxes are properly grounded, either through metal conduit or a grounding wire, to provide a safe path for electrical faults .

Step 4: Connect the Wires

- o Strip the insulation from the ends of each wire.
- o Use wire nuts or approved connectors to splice wires together inside the junction box. Typically, connect black (hot) wires together, white (neutral) wires together, and green or bare (ground) wires together .
- o If connecting two boxes, run the cable from one box to the other, securing it with clamps or staples as required by code .

Step 5: Final Checks

- o Ensure all connections are tight and no bare wire is exposed.
- o Install the box cover to protect the connections from accidental contact and debris .



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- o Restore power and test the circuit to confirm proper operation.

Safety Tips

- o Always wear insulated gloves and safety glasses when working with electricity .
- o Never work on live circuits.
