

# Is using fiber optic cable as a router a good option and how do I set it up

## Article Overview

Fiber optic cables do not work with all routers directly; you need an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to convert the fiber signal for use with most standard routers.

## Router Compatibility

Most home routers cannot accept a fiber optic cable directly because fiber transmits data as light, while routers use electrical signals over Ethernet. To use fiber internet, your router must have a Gigabit Ethernet WAN port to connect to the ONT, which converts the optical signal into Ethernet . Routers designed for DSL or cable (with phone line or coaxial inputs) are not compatible with fiber. Modern routers with Wi-Fi 6 or 6E are recommended to fully utilize high-speed fiber connections .

## Step-by-Step Setup

- o Confirm ONT Installation: Your ISP typically installs an ONT at your home, which serves as the interface between the fiber line and your network .
- o Connect Fiber to ONT: Plug the fiber optic cable into the ONT's optical port, handling the connector carefully to avoid damage .
- o Link ONT to Router: Use a standard Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN port to your router's WAN port .
- o Power On Devices: Turn on the ONT first, wait for the status lights to stabilize, then power on your router .
- o Configure Router: Access the router's admin panel via a web browser (e.g., 192.168.1.1) and enter any ISP credentials if required. Update firmware for optimal performance .
- o Test Connection: Connect a device via Wi-Fi or Ethernet and run a speed test to verify your fiber connection .
- o Troubleshoot if Needed: If the connection fails, reboot the ONT and router, check cable connections, or contact your ISP .
