- o Depth is critical for accommodating multiple wires and devices. Standard depths range from 120 mm to 300 mm for wall-mounted units, while freestanding cabinets may exceed 600 mm .
- o Internal volume must comply with wiring and safety standards, ensuring sufficient space for conductors, splicing, and future expansion .

Material and Protection

- o KTV distribution boxes are often made from metal or high-quality plastic, with IP ratings for dust and water resistance, especially for stage or outdoor use .
- o Rugged construction ensures impact resistance, high-temperature tolerance, and electrical insulation, which is essential for high-load or frequently reconfigured setups .

- o Assess load and circuit count: More circuits require deeper or larger boxes.
- o Plan for future expansion: Choose a box with extra internal volume to avoid overcrowding.
- o Check mounting type: Wall-mounted vs. freestanding affects footprint and accessibility.
- o Verify manufacturer specifications: Catalog dimensions often list external HxWxD; internal usable space is smaller due to wall thickness, gaskets, and mounting hardware . By selecting the appropriate size and type, KTV electrical distribution boxes can safely accommodate all wiring, switches, and protective devices while

allowing for easy maintenance and upgrades.
