

Om4 optical cable paired with om3 optical fiber

Article Overview

OM4 and OM3 fibers are physically compatible, but the network performance will be limited by the OM3 segment.

Compatibility

OM3 and OM4 are both laser-optimized multimode fibers with a 50/125 um core/cladding structure, which means they can be physically connected using standard connectors such as LC, SC, or MTP/MPO without special adapters . This makes it possible to integrate OM4 cables into existing OM3 networks or vice versa.

Performance Considerations

o

Bandwidth and Distance: OM4 has a higher modal bandwidth (4700 MHz.km) compared to OM3 (2000 MHz.km), allowing longer distances and higher data rates. When OM4 is connected to OM3, the overall link performance is constrained by the OM3 fiber, meaning the maximum distance and speed will follow OM3 specifications . For example, 10G Ethernet can reach up to 300 meters on OM3 and up to 550 meters on OM4, but a mixed link will be limited to 300 meters.

Insertion Loss and Attenuation: Both fibers have similar insertion loss, but OM4 generally offers slightly better performance due to higher-quality materials. Testing is recommended to ensure the combined link does not exceed acceptable loss limits .

Practical Deployment Scenarios

Upgrading Existing Networks: If an existing network uses OM3, adding OM4 in new segments can improve performance in high-demand areas, but the benefits are limited by the OM3 portions .

o

New Installations: For new networks, using OM4 throughout is ideal for future-proofing. However, a mixed deployment can be cost-effective if OM3 is sufficient for less critical segments .

o

Data Centers: High-speed applications like 40G or 100G Ethernet benefit from OM4, but careful planning is needed when OM3 is present to avoid bottlenecks .

Connector and Color Coding

OM3 and OM4 fibers often use different color-coded connectors: aqua for OM3 and magenta for OM4. Proper identification ensures correct connections and minimizes errors during installation . Connector polishing (PC or UPC) is also important to maintain signal integrity.
