General Safety Measures

- o **Power Off Before Work:** Always turn off the power supply before mounting, dismounting, wiring, or inspecting a switch to prevent electric shock or switch damage .
- o **Avoid Live Wiring:** Never perform wiring while the switch is energized, and avoid touching charged terminals during operation .
- o **Grounding:** Connect the switch's ground terminal to a proper ground wire to prevent electrical hazards .
- o **Insulation and Clearance:** Maintain appropriate insulation distances between wires and ensure proper spacing to avoid short circuits .

- o **Micro vs High-Capacity Loads:** Avoid using a switch designed for high current to control micro currents; use relays if switching both types of loads .

Environmental and Installation Precautions

- o **Sealed Switches:** In environments with water, dust, or corrosive elements, use sealed switches to prevent damage .
- o **Temperature Range:** Ensure the switch operates within its specified temperature range, typically -40°C to 85°C, to maintain reliability .
- o **Shock and Vibration Protection:** Industrial switches should be shock-proof, anti-static, and vibration-resistant for harsh environments .
- o **Proper Mounting:** Use one-way screws or secure mounting methods to prevent accidental removal, and protect switches with covers and warning signs .
