Clearances: Maintain at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above trays for installation and maintenance access (2026 NEC update). These systems, made from metal or plastic, are open structures designed to support electrical conductors, ensuring proper organization and safety. Whether for installation or routine inspections, a well-designed cable tray access path not only enhances operational efficiency but. At least 12 inches of access above cable trays shall be provided and maintained to permit access for installing and maintaining the cables. Code Change Summary: Revised code language in Section 392.
