

Standard distance between cable tray hangers and cable tray width

Article Overview

Cable tray widths typically start at 0.1 meters, and hanger spacing should generally not exceed 1.5 meters, depending on tray type and load.

Cable Tray Width

The minimum width of a cable tray is generally 0.1 meters, with standard widths varying to accommodate different cable capacities and types of installations . Width is a critical factor because it determines the cable fill capacity, airflow for heat dissipation, and ease of cable pulling . Wider trays allow for better organization and reduce the risk of overheating, while narrower trays are suitable for small control circuits or limited cable runs. The usable inside width is slightly less than the overall tray width due to side rail thickness, which should be considered when planning penetrations or mounting points .

Hanger Spacing

Hangers or supports are essential for maintaining the structural integrity of cable trays. The distance between hangers typically should not exceed 1.5 meters for horizontal runs, although this can vary depending on the tray type, material, and load . For vertical cable tray runs, supports should be fixed to the building structure with a spacing preferably less than 2 meters . Key points for hanger placement include:

- o At the start and end of the tray
- o At corners, T-junctions, and bends
- o When the tray spans more than 30 meters
- o To prevent sagging and ensure proper load distribution

Spacing Between Trays

When installing parallel cable trays, the minimum horizontal distance should be 0.6 meters to allow maintenance access, inspection, and proper airflow . For power and signal trays, a separation of 0.5 meters is recommended to reduce electromagnetic interference, which can be reduced to 0.3 meters if the trays are shielded . Vertical spacing for floor-mounted trays should be at least 150 millimeters, and the top of the tray should maintain a minimum clearance of 0.3 meters from ceilings or obstructions .
