The zinc coating provides excellent corrosion resistance, making these trays suitable for both indoor and outdoor applications. When field modifications are made, the cut surfaces are often treated with a zinc-rich compound to maintain protection against corrosion .

Stainless Steel

Stainless steel cable trays are a premium option for environments where corrosion is a major concern, such as coastal areas, chemical plants, food processing, and pharmaceutical facilities. Stainless steel contains chromium, which forms a passive oxide layer on the surface, providing superior corrosion resistance and durability. These trays are also more aesthetically pleasing and can withstand high temperatures, but they are more expensive than mild or galvanized steel trays .
