A combo port, also known as an optoelectronic multiplexing interface, is a photoelectric composite port with two kinds of Ethernet interfaces (RJ45 port and SFP port) on an Ethernet switch. An all-optical Ethernet switch is a network switch whose service ports are entirely optical, meaning every interface uses fiber rather than copper. Port types are limited to two: optical and Ethernet. In other words, it is a compound port that can support two different physical layers and share the same.
