- o Maintain proper ventilation and avoid damp or humid locations to prevent electrical hazards .
- o Follow local electrical codes (NEC, IEC, or other regional standards) to ensure the installation is compliant .
- o Label all circuits clearly and provide adequate clearance around the panel for maintenance and emergency access .

It is safer to install the panel at a standard, reachable height in a dry, unobstructed area such as a utility room, garage, or near the main electrical entry point .
