

What bill of quantities and quotas should be used for cable trays

To apply a BOQ and quotas for cable trays, systematically measure tray lengths, calculate support requirements, determine fill ratios, and organize items in a structured BOQ for accurate costing and installation planning.

Step 1: Understand Project Specifications

Begin by reviewing the architectural, structural, and electrical drawings along with technical specifications. Identify all areas where cable trays are required, including tray types, widths, materials, and routing paths. Ensure compliance with NEC Article 392, which defines tray sizing, fill limits, and installation standards for safety and efficiency .

Step 2: Perform Quantity Takeoffs

Measure the total length of each cable tray run directly from drawings or using digital tools like On-Screen Take-Off (OST) or BIM models. Calculate the number of supports using the formula: $\text{Support Quantity} = \frac{\text{Total Length}}{\text{Support Spacing}} + 1$ For example, a 20-meter tray with supports every 2 meters requires 11 supports . Also, calculate the cable fill ratio, ensuring it does not exceed 50% of the tray cross-section for safe installation .

Step 3: Classify and Group Items

Organize the BOQ into logical categories for clarity and tendering purposes. Typical groupings for cable trays include:

- o Tray types (ladder, perforated, solid bottom)
- o Tray widths and materials (steel, aluminum, PVC)
- o Supports and brackets
- o Accessories (couplers, bends, reducers)
- o Labor for installation and testing

Step 4: Assign Units and Rates

Each BOQ item should have a unit of measurement (e.g., meters for trays, pieces for supports) and a unit rate based on market prices or project-specific costs. Multiply the unit rate by the measured quantity to calculate the total cost for each item .

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Step 5: Summarize and Review

Add totals for each category and the overall project. Include provisional sums for unforeseen variations. Review the BOQ to ensure all quantities, units, and calculations are accurate, and that the document is traceable back to drawings and specifications .

Step 6: Apply Quotas

Quotas define the standard quantities or allowances for materials and labor. For cable trays, quotas may include:

- o Maximum number of cables per tray section (based on fill ratio)
 - o Standard support spacing
 - o Typical labor hours per meter of tray installation
- Applying quotas ensures consistency, prevents overloading, and facilitates fair tendering and cost control .

Step 7: Finalize BOQ for Tendering

Ensure the BOQ is structured logically, clear, and tender-ready. Each line should be measurable, priced fairly, and referenced to the drawings. This allows contractors to bid accurately and reduces disputes during execution .
