

What colors should be used for wiring in the power distribution cabinet

Power distribution cabinet wiring typically follows IEC and NEN-EN-IEC 61439 standards, with specific colors for AC, DC, control, and protective conductors to ensure safety and easy identification.

AC Power Wiring (IEC / European Standards)

- o Line (Phase) Conductors: Brown, Black, Gray (for three-phase systems)
- o Neutral: Blue
- o Protective Earth (Ground): Green/Yellow striped
- o Control Circuits: Red for AC control currents These colors are recommended for clarity and safety, though in control cabinets, some flexibility is allowed if the wire ends are clearly marked .

DC Power Wiring

- o Main DC Power Chains: Black
- o DC Control Circuits: Blue (dark blue)
- o Special Power Chains: Orange (for circuits that may remain live when the main switch is off)
- o Protective Earth: Green/Yellow striped This coding helps distinguish DC circuits from AC circuits within the same cabinet .

NEN-EN-IEC 61439 Specifics

- o The standard allows some flexibility in color usage inside control cabinets, provided there is no confusion.
- o Green or yellow alone should not be used except in the green-yellow combination for protective earth.
- o For multi-core cables where recommended insulation colors are unavailable, exceptions are permitted .

Practical Tips for Cabinet Wiring

- o Labeling: Even if color coding is followed, labeling wire ends or using colored heat shrink or tape improves clarity.
- o Consistency: Maintain consistent color usage throughout the cabinet to simplify maintenance and troubleshooting.
- o Safety: Always verify voltage and polarity before working on circuits, as older installations may not follow current standards .
