

What does pigtail fiber look like

A pigtail fiber is a short optical fiber with a factory-terminated connector on one end and a bare, exposed fiber on the other.

A fiber optic pigtail typically consists of a single, short length of optical fiber, usually between 0.5 meters and 5 meters, depending on the application . One end has a factory-polished connector--commonly LC, SC, or FC types--used to plug into equipment, patch panels, or optical distribution frames. The other end is bare fiber, stripped of its protective jacket, designed to be fusion-spliced or mechanically spliced to a bulk fiber cable in the field . Physical characteristics include:

- o Tight-buffered fiber (around 0.9mm diameter) for protection inside enclosures.
- o Ceramic ferrule at the connector end, often 1.25mm or 2.5mm, providing precise alignment for low insertion loss and high return loss .
- o Flexible, unjacketed bare fiber on the splicing end, which is relatively fragile and must be handled carefully.
- o Color-coded jackets or connectors to indicate fiber type (single-mode, multimode, or specialty fibers) and connector polish (UPC or APC) for easy identification . Unlike a patch cord, which has connectors on both ends, a pigtail is single-ended, making it ideal for permanent or semi-permanent installations where fibers from a multi-fiber trunk need to be terminated neatly and reliably . In practical terms, it looks like a short cable with a small connector on one end and a thin, exposed fiber "tail" on the other, ready for splicing into a network.
