Internal Volume and Capacity

The internal volume of a distribution box is designed to accommodate circuit breakers, bus bars, and wiring. For single-gang or small junction boxes, internal volumes are usually 18-22.5 cubic inches, sufficient for a single device and a few cables . Multi-gang boxes (2-4 gang) increase width proportionally, typically 4-8 inches wide, while maintaining a standard height of around 4 inches and varying depth to handle multiple conductors . Depth is critical: deeper boxes (up to 3.5 inches or more) are recommended when wire count is high to prevent overcrowding and comply with NEC fill requirements .

Material and Mounting Considerations

Distribution boxes are available in metal or plastic, with similar face dimensions but differing internal volume and depth options . Wall-mounted boxes are most common in residential settings, while freestanding cabinets are used for larger installations. Proper sizing ensures safe wiring, easier installation, and compliance with electrical codes .
