

What s the best way to cut the steel wire for pigtails

Tool Selection

Preparation

- o Secure the wire in a vise or clamp to prevent movement, which reduces the risk of jagged cuts or injury .
- o For stranded wire, wrap the cut area with electrical tape or thin wire to prevent fraying and maintain strand alignment .

- o Place the wire fully into the cutter's jaws, ensuring it is centered for a straight cut .
- o Apply steady, firm pressure rather than jerky force to avoid deforming the wire or damaging the tool .
- o For very fine or delicate pigtail wires, manual diagonal cutters are usually sufficient and provide precise control .

- o Always wear safety glasses to protect against flying metal fragments .
- o Use heavy-duty gloves to prevent cuts from sharp wire ends .
- o Keep the work area clear of flammable materials if using power tools like grinders, as sparks are generated .

Finishing

After cutting, inspect the wire ends. If any strands are frayed, trim them carefully or use a small file to smooth the edges before forming the pigtail. This ensures a secure and reliable connection when twisting or crimping the wire. By following these steps--selecting the right tool, securing the wire, applying proper cutting



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technique, and observing safety precautions--you can achieve clean, precise cuts suitable for pigtail connections without damaging the wire or risking injury .
